

**SITE\_SPECIFIC  
FINAL PROJECT**

For your final project each of you will create a site specific work that we will tour the final two days of our class (May 1 and May 3). As agreed, each of you will post background information about your project to the web for the reviewers and your fellow classmates to review in advance of the tour. In addition you should be prepared to talk briefly about your project on-site.

**Site-specific work** (due May 1 or 3)

For your final project you are responsible for creating a site specific work. As you refine your final projects keep several things in mind:

1. What is the urban dynamic that you have become interested in, through your research over the course of the semester? How does your piece intervene in this dynamic? What relationships do you hope to provoke through your intervention?
2. How does your project react to Hertzian space as we have discussed it over the course of the semester?
3. How would you like the reviewers and your classmates to experience your project during the tour?

**Web Site** (due April 26)

Create a clear web site detailing information about your project. Post the URL for your web site to the class blog by 12:00 on April 26<sup>th</sup>.

1. Title + author/authors
2. Include a project description.
  - a. Most importantly, this should describe an urban dynamic that you have become interested in, through your research over the course of the semester, and how your piece intervenes in this dynamic. What relationships do you hope to provoke through your intervention?
  - b. What is your site or site typology. What is the location of the site we will visit on the tour. Make sure to propose a site that is close enough to the CCA campus that we can easily walk to it.
  - c. In addition, describe how your project engages the themes of the class (Hertzian space, locative media, etc.)
  - d. Be sure to qualify your project as a mapping, probe, tour, performance or hybrid of these artistic strategies.
3. Create a downloadable PDF file measuring standard letter size (8 1/2 x 11). This page should feature:
  - a. Your project title
  - b. An abbreviated project description.

- c. The location of the site for the tour.
  - d. The project web site address.
  - e. Any other relevant information that you would like the reviewers, and your classmates, to consider while viewing your project on-site.
4. If you have done experiments, iterations, or your project is underway, please include documentation of the project on your web site.
  5. If you plan to continue with your project and see your site for the tour as part of a larger piece, describe your future plans.
